How many freshmen enter TCEC each fall?

We accept 40 freshmen each year. Rising sophomores are also welcome to apply.

Will the bus come pick me up?

Yes. Both Cherokee and Clay County buses will pick you up at your home. You will get on a bus at the high school in your district which will bring you to Tri-County Early College and return you in the afternoons. You can also drive if you have a car.

Do I have to be a straight "A" student?

No, you just have to be dedicated and committed to working hard and getting a higher education.

Do you have lockers?

No, since we are on the Community College campus, you will use your book bag.

Do you have sports or music?

TCEC offers many extracurricular activities and clubs such as Junior Civitan, Student Council, Robotics, Music Club, Interact Club, Beta Club, Spanish Club, Christian Fellowship, and Principal's Ambassadors. Students can take classes in Art, Vocal Music, Journalism, and Dramatic Literature. We offer competitive sports in Cross Country, Swimming, Track, Golf, and Soccer.

Do you have Prom and other fun social activities?

Yes, we have a Fall/Winter Formal for grades 9-13 and a Junior-Senior Prom. We also have a schoolwide picnic with our partner school from Denmark, a Halloween Social with TCCC, Spirit Week, and a trip to Lake Chatuge at the end of each school year. There is always something fun going on at TCEC!

Do you take classes with College Students?

Yes and No. 9th and 10th graders primarily take college classes only with other Early College students. Upperclassmen start to take classes with other Tri-County Community College students. It's a good mix.

What happens if I am not prepared for college classes?

That is what the high school teachers and your college liaison are here for....support! They will teach you how to organize, study, plan, take notes and manage your time. They will talk to you about your future career and educational options and opportunities. Students also have the option of a fifth year of high school which allows for a slower pace to earn both a high school diploma and two years of college credits.

Do you have on-line courses?

Yes! We have many online classes to choose from. Every student will take at least one during high school.

What supplies do I need?

Everyone at Tri-County Early College gets an electronic device to use throughout their high school career. A list of other basic school supplies and materials needed for your high school classes is published each summer before classes begin in August.

Are there school uniforms?

No, but you still have to follow the Cherokee County Schools dress code.

Do you serve breakfast and lunch?

Yes. Both meals are catered from a nearby school so students have the option of a hot meal if they choose. You can also bring your lunch if you want. Breakfast is provided free to everyone.

Can I take Driver's Education through TCEC?

Yes. Rising 9th graders should take the Driver's Education class offered online through the Cherokee County Schools website. Students will then drive with the instructor at TCEC.

Do you go on Field Trips?

Yes! We take students on different college tours each year and different classes take many trips throughout the year.

Do I have to pay for my college classes?

No! All books, fees, and tuition are covered by this program. With hard work, you can earn two years of college for free!

What are the Associate's Degree Programs we can obtain at Tri-County Early College?

Students are automatically enrolled in TCCC's College Transfer Degree Program, however, different options are available to students after the first year is completed.

Will I have to wait until my Junior Year to take college classes like students in traditional schools?

No. All TCEC students begin taking college classes during the first semester of their freshman year.

Will my college credits transfer to other 4-year colleges/universities?

Yes, to all 17 UNC System Schools: ASU, ECU, ECSU, FSU, NC AA&T, NCCU, UNCA, UNC-CH, UNCG, UNCP, UNCW, UNC ARTS, WCU, WSSU, NCSSM. Credits are also usually accepted in private schools and schools outside the UNC system.
